- Performed 75 cataract surgeries and 25 surgeries for individuals with crossed eyes in Juliaca, a Peruvian mountain village in a remote area of the Andes Mountains
- Provides service in the local community, including donating time to a tennis/character-building program for inner city youths in Trenton
- Serves on the Advisory Board to the Princeton First Aid and Rescue Squad
